MOTIVATIONAL LECTURE BY MR. BALA KRISHNA SHRESTHA

Mr. Bala Krishna Shrestha, Chairman of HAMA Group of Industries and many other known companies, delivered a special motivational lecture on his life-time achievements and experiences on **27 August 2016**. On **24 September 2016**, MBA/EMBA students had a wonderful opportunity to interact with **Mr. Hari Bhakta Sharma, President of CNI (Confederation of Nepalese Industries)** and Executive Director in Deurali - Janta Pharmaceuticals P Ltd., and a renowned entrepreneur and business leader of the country.
