future endeavours. Talking about success, our students of Grades XI and XII made us proud by bagging the first and third positions in the Inter-College English Essay Writing Competition.

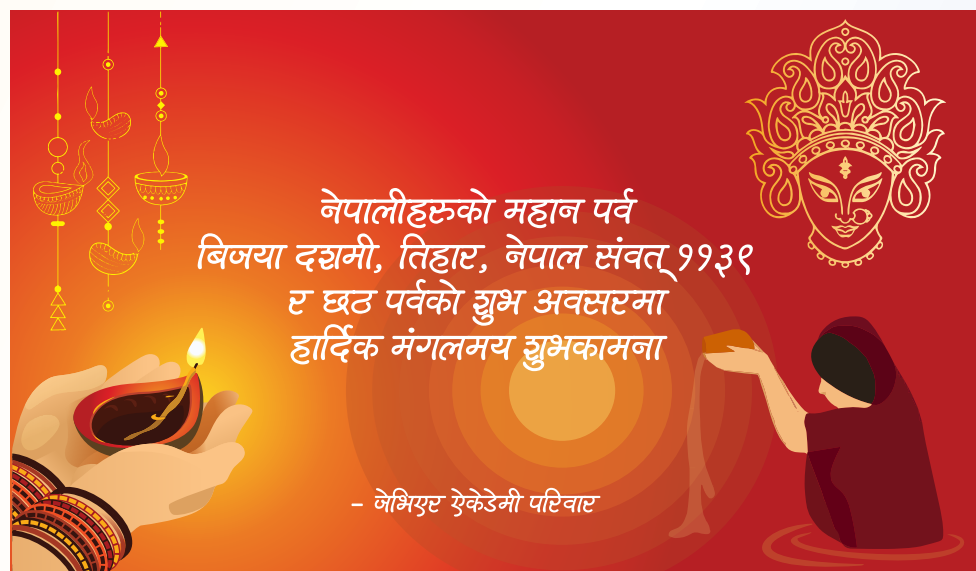

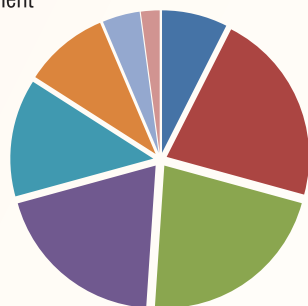

THREE DAY INDUSTRIAL TOUR TO LUMBINI- CHITWAN

As a part of the approved Academic/Activity Calendar, 19 students of 2nd semester, MBA 16th batch, accompanied by the Dy Programme Coordinator went on a 3-day industrial tour to Lumbini, Sauraha, Parasi and Chitwan.

It was a great opportunity for students to explore different parts of Nepal, experience the beauty and rich heritage of country.

First day of the tour started with the visit to World Heritage Site, Lumbini. It is a Buddhist pilgrimage site in Rupandehi District of Province No. 5 in Nepal. Students loved the peaceful atmosphere and above all the Mayadevi Temple, which is one of the best

archaeological evidences of Lord Buddha. The site was blend of beautiful monasteries built by different Buddhist countries like China, Japan, Sri Lanka, Myanmar, as well as Germany.
