SKIN CARE AWARENESS PROGRAM



On 27 November 2018 Skin Care Awareness Programme was conducted by the dermatologist, Dr. Bikrant Dhakal. During the programme, he explained the fact that our skin differs from person to person. According to him, our skin falls in one of the five different types. They are *normal*, *dry*, *oily*, *combination* or *sensitive*.

He explained that in order to take proper care of our skin, we have to know our skin type first. All skin types should be protected from excessive exposure to the harmful ultraviolet (UV) rays of the sun. In the programme, the audience was made aware of excessive exposure to UV rays which are harmful to our skin as it causes several skin problems like tanning, skin aging, wrinkles, and even skin cancer. He further explained that there are two different types

of UV rays viz. UVA and UVB rays. UVA rays are responsible for causing tanning, skin aging and wrinkles. UVB rays play a key role in developing skin cancer.

Dr. Dhakal explained that we can protect our skin from the harmful UV rays by applying sunscreen. According to him, the SPF on sunscreen protects our skin from UVB rays, and if we want protection from both the types of UV rays then we should look for the sunscreen with broad spectrum label on it. He also suggested applying sunscreen liberally to all the exposed skin 30 minutes prior to exposure to the sun and should reapply it every two hours.

Everyone present in the hall found the talk programme informative. The programme ended after the question-answer session.

Teams were challenged to develop a marketing plan

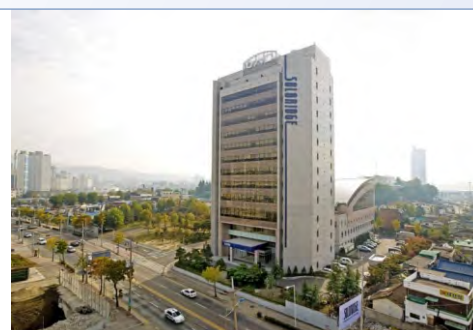

With the state-of-art infrastructure comprising fully modern dairy plants, 11 cheese manufacturing units, 45 milk chilling plants as well as highly qualified dairy specialists, DDC is a precious asset in the economic development of our nation.

At DDC, students observed that the company has strict adherence to the quality of milk & milk products, hygiene, and sanitation of the plants. DDC pledge to

During the visit, students learnt and observed the entire manufacturing process and the supply chain of DDC right from the collection of dairy inputs, auxiliary raw material, mixing, assembling, counting packaging and dispatching to the market.
