Dear Students, Alumni, Parents, Guardians, Faculty, Staff, Friends and Well-wishers of Xavier Academy (XA) and Kathmandu Don Bosco College (KDBC),

On the auspicious occasion of our biggest festival, Dashain, let us seek the Divine Blessings of Goddess Durga Bhavani for a more peaceful, progressive and prosperous Nepal, and, once again, celebrate the victory of good over evil. However, many families, who lost their loved ones during the Gen G protest on 8 September, and the next day, 9 September, and in the subsequent days, and the injured, some grievously, and their families will not be celebrating Dashain.

Xavier Academy wishes eternal peace to all the fallen heroes, who made the ultimate sacrifice in their fight against rampant corruption. We offer heartfelt condolences to the grieving parents and family members and pray for the expeditious recovery of the injured. The sheer mass of people who turned up to protest in the street on 8 September, demanding for better accountability, better education and better employment opportunities within the country, was completely unexpected and indicated how fed up the general populace was with the state of affairs within the country and with leaders of the major political parties, who have become Prime Ministers repeatedly, and their political cadres, who have, time and again, put the party's interests above national interests. The frustration and anger on the streets on the first day were met with live bullets. The resultant public anger the next day resulted in more deaths, more injuries and destruction of very important public and commercial buildings as well as residences of the leaders and their cronies. While loss of precious lives cannot be pardoned under any circumstances, and the perpetrators must be brought to justice, the damage of many of our important state buildings and the valuable documents these buildings contained, by miscreants and lumpen elements must be condemned and the guilty must be prosecuted.

In memory of all our fallen heroes, **Xavier Academy organized a special online condolence meeting on 17 September 2025** to wish eternal peace to the fallen heroes, offer condolences to the grieving parents/family members, and pray for expeditious recovery of the injured.

During this special condolence meeting, I read the message that I had posted in my Facebook on 13 September 2025. The following message is one of reflection and hope:

MESSAGE OF REFLECTION AND HOPE

The ominous and heavy clouds of pain and uncertainty that engulfed Nepal from 8 to 12 September 2025 have begun to lift. With the appointment of the former Chief Justice as our nation's first female Prime Minister, the sun shines once again on our land, illuminating the path ahead.

To our Gen Z citizens (1997–2012), we offer our profound respect and admiration. In just a few days, you demonstrated courage, determination, and a unity of purpose that has transformed the course of our history. But this achievement came at a heartbreaking cost—the loss of many young lives, countless injuries, and the destruction of public institutions that belonged to us all. We extend our deepest condolences to grieving families and pray for eternal peace for the departed. We wish strength and recovery to those who were injured and continue to suffer.

Your actions have reminded us—Boomers (1946–1964), Gen X (1965–1980), and Millennials (1981–1996)—that merely voicing frustrations in private is not enough. For too long, we placed our hopes in leaders who repeatedly failed to honor their promises. They repeatedly failed to read the writing on the wall, understand the grief, frustrations and rising anger of the common populace. Rampant corruption at every level, the exodus of our best and brightest youth seeking better education, jobs and better life abroad, and the painful sacrifices of our migrant workers have eroded national confidence. We, the older generations, have failed you. We must accept responsibility. We did not do enough to protect your future. We watched helplessly as the corrupt politicians allowed too many of our brightest and best students to leave in increasing numbers every year, often never to return, and in doing so we weakened the very foundation of our nation. By staying silent, we gave free reign to the corrupt politicians to make as much money and as quickly as possible.

Let us now hope that this time, the sun will shine brighter than ever—energizing every Nepali to focus on peace, progress, and prosperity. For far too long, bureaucracy, favoritism, and corruption have suffocated meritocracy and sidelined national priorities. Nepotism, cronyism, and short-term political gamesmanship have eroded public trust, culminating in the eruption of Gen Z's justified anger.

The fact that governments have changed frequently, while the same three leaders of major political parties have occupied the post of Prime Minister repeatedly—12 times in total—only deepened public despair. The social ban was merely the spark, the deeper fuel was decades of broken promises.

But now, it is time for introspection, reconciliation, and unity. It is time to rebuild—to create a peaceful, progressive, and prosperous Nepal that belongs to all of us.

The statistics speak volumes. In 2017/18, about 31,000 students left for education abroad; by last year (2024/25), that number had surged to 123,589, draining nearly a billion US dollars from our treasury. In the same year, 1,172,020 Nepalis left for foreign employment. This relentless outflow of both talent and labor has not shaken our political class, who benefited even as our nation's future was compromised. If this trend continues, our aspirations to graduate from Least Developed Country status in 2026, become a middle-income country by 2030, and ultimately reach developed nation status by 2050 will remain distant dreams.

The immediate responsibility of the new Interim Government is to prepare for fair and credible elections within six months. Yet equally important is laying the foundation for meaningful reforms—ensuring quality education, creating dignified jobs at home, and restoring faith in the system so that our youth need not leave the country to pursue their dreams.

Let us come together—across generations, regions, and backgrounds—to rebuild Nepal. Let us once again show the world that no challenge is too great for a united and resilient nation. We are a people of hope, forgiveness, and strength. If we stand together, we can make our country peaceful, progressive and prosperous.

Let us all be united all the time and move forward with resolve and commitment to make our country stronger and better.

I wish all of my Grade XI and Grade XII students the very best in the upcoming 1st Term Examinations as well wish all the KDBC students success in their various exams.



We pray for eternal peace to the “fallen heroes” and offer our heartfelt condolences to the grieving parents and family members. Let us ensure that they have not lost their lives in vain.

We wish expeditious recovery to those who are injured.

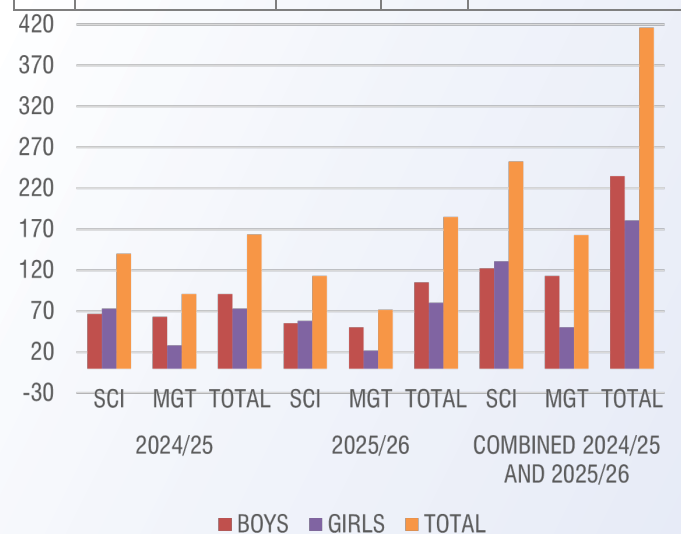
